Practical Information

Plan ahead and find out if you need your passport, visa, national ID or all of the above! Passport or National ID

Remember: by law, you must carry your passport or ID card with you at all times in Italy. You'll be asked to show it when you check in to hotels.

Naples is located in Italy, in the European Union since 1958, making it part of the Schengen Area, so EU nationals and citizens of 28 other countries only need their passport or national identity card to enter as tourists for a period of up to 90 days.

EU, EEA and Swiss Citizens

As citizens of the European Union and European Economic Area, you will not need a visa to enter the country. A valid passport or national identity card is required.

<u>EU member countries:</u> Germany, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Croatia, Denmark, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Czech Republic, Romania and Sweden.

EEA countries: Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway.

How to get to the airport from Naples?

Naples International Ariport (NAP) is located just 4 miles (6 km) northeast of Naples city centre in the Capodichino district, the International Airport is easy to get to and to get around. Built as a military airport that held great importance during the two world wars, Naples International Airport began commercial use in 1950, and has been developing ever since, despite its small size. With just one terminal for regular flights (the second is used for charter flights), the airport still receives around a million passengers each year.

There are a number of different ways to travel between Naples city centre and its airport, the most common:

Bus

Alibus connects the airport and the city centre with daily departures every 15 to 20 minutes from 5:45 am to 11:45 pm. The <u>bus</u> makes three stops: one at the bus station and two more in the port area, and the journey takes between 15 and 35 minutes depending where you get off. A one way ticket costs € 5 and should be bought directly on the bus.

Taxi

When you get a <u>taxi</u> from the airport to Naples city centre, you have the option between paying a fixed price depending on the distance, or using the meter. The fixed price between the airport and the main train station is \notin 20, and to the port area is \notin 23, and \notin 25 to Chiaia, Mergellina and Posillipo. There is a minimum charge of the is \notin 3.50 (\notin 6.50 on Sunday).

Pre-booked transfer

The easiest way to travel between Naples and its airport is to pre-book a transfer service. The driver will pick you up from the arrivals hall and take you to your preferred destination in a comfortable private vehicle. Prices range € 35 one way for a three-passenger car: check out our transfer rates from Naples Airport here.

METRO in Naples

With two underground lines and 26 stops around the city, plus trains running along the coast to places like <u>Pompeii</u>, Naples' metro network is easy to use.

Schedule & frequency

The Naples metro runs daily from 6 am to 11 pm, with departures from every 6 minutes to every 15 minutes.

Ticket prices

For tourists, the best option is usually to buy single tickets, which cost \in 1.10 each. However, if you're planning on using the public transport network a lot, there is also the option to purchase a day ticket, costing \in 4.50 for unlimited use of the metro, <u>bus</u> and funicular systems.

Lines

With just two lines, the Naples metro network is easy to use. Line 1 covers a total distance of 11 miles (18 km) and has 19 stops. It is known as the "Art Line", thanks to the incredible works of art which decorate its stops: don't miss checking out Garibaldi, Toledo and Universidad to feel like you're in a museum!

The other line is line 6, which is currently under construction.

Trains

In addition to the metro system, Naples has a good train network connecting the city to nearby places of interest, as well as other cities in Italy. Each of the different tourist destinations in this guide have transport information for any trains that stop nearby.

Funicular

Naples is also known for its funicular railways providing excellent panoramic views over the surrounding area. Three services connect central Naples to the hilltop district of Vomero, while a fourth connects the coastal districts of Mergellina and Posillipo Hill. They operate from 7am to 10pm daily and tickets are the same as for the metro and bus:

- Funicolare Centrale: from Piazzetta Augusteo to Piazza Fuga.
- Funicolare di Chiaia: from Via del Parco Margherita to Via Domenico Cimarosa.
- Funicolare di Montesanto: from Piazza Montesanto to Via Raffaele Morghen.
- Funicolare di Mergellina: connects the waterfront at Via Mergellina with Via Manzoni.

BUSES in Naples

The historic centre of Naples can be easily explored on foot, but the bus network is a good way to reach its outskirts and nearby sights.

Bus routes

The Naples bus network has 150 different lines, providing comprehensive travel around the historic centre as well as the surrounding area. From a tourist's point of view, unless you're staying far outside of the city centre, you probably won't need to take the bus much. In each page of this guide dedicated to <u>Naples' main places of interest</u>, we have included the relevant bus routes to take if this is the most convenient mode of transport for you.

Most of the bus routes that you'll be interested in as a tourist have a stop in Piazza Garibaldi.

Ticket prices

The bus network in Naples is run by the same company as the <u>metro</u>, so the tickets cost the same amount. If you're only planning a couple of journeys, buy single tickets for \notin 1.50 each, or if you're planning on using the public transport network a lot, there is also the option to purchase a day ticket, costing \notin 4.50 for unlimited use of the metro and bus systems.

TAXIS in Naples

While it's easy to get around Naples on foot or by public transport, you may sometimes find it easier to travel by taxi. Find fares and top tips here!

Official taxis in Naples are white and just like in other cities, you can catch a taxi from set stops or flag one down in the street. They use a meter, but be aware that there are a number of additional charges for various different extras.

Prices

- Starting fare: € 3.50
- Starting fare on Sundays and public holidays: € 6.50.
- Every 48 metres of the journey: € 0.05.

Additional charges

- Each piece of luggage: € 0.50.
- Trips starting from the airport (for fixed prices see our <u>Naples Airport</u> <u>guide</u>): € 5.
- Trips to the airport: € 4.

Prices increase on Sundays, public holidays and at night.


